The Brewers' Company is one of the oldest livery companies in the City of London. The earliest surviving reference to an organised group of brewers in the City of London was in 1292. However, it was not until 1437 that they were incorporated as a Livery Company. No one quite knows why St Thomas à Becket was chosen as the Brewers' patron saint. Possibly it was because when Becket went to France in 1158 to secure the hand of Princess Margaret for Henry, son of Henry II, he took among his gifts two wagons loaded with ale. An alternative tradition is that pilgrims on the way to Canterbury to worship at Becket's shrine drank a great deal of ale which increased brewers' profits so much that they felt it appropriate to dedicate themselves to him out of gratitude. The connection with Becket was directly incorporated into the Company's first grant of arms in 1468, when Becket's arms were impaled with those of the Company.

The Brewers' Hall is situated in Aldermanbury Square, the open space between the Guildhall and London Wall.

It is one of the City of London's premier venues for corporate or social events, hosting banquets, conferences, exhibitions, receptions, training courses, presentations and more intimate occasions such as wedding receptions, annual dinners and signing ceremonies.
