

Hampton Court Palace Surrey, KT8 9AU

Hampton Court Palace is a story of two palaces: a Tudor palace, magnificently developed by Cardinal Wolsey and later Henry VIII, alongside a baroque palace built by William III and Mary II.

In 1838, the young Queen Victoria ordered that Hampton Court Palace 'should be thrown open to all her subjects without restriction.'

At this time, antiquarians and architects showed an interest in the surviving parts of the historic Tudor palace and undertook restoration work.

In the 1970s and early 1980s, exhibitions were introduced and more improvements made in the State Apartments, but all this was interrupted in 1986 by a fire that severely damaged a large part of the King's Apartments.

Repairs took six years and led to the largest series of restorations at the palace since the 1880s.



Over the centuries this palace has hosted some of the most lavish celebrations ever seen. Home to Henry VIII and some of the most famous kings and queens of England, it makes an unforgettable location for your function or event.
